#### Honouring our namesake, honouring our past: RCSCC Skeena / HMCS Skeena

The 116 Royal Canadian Sea Cadet Corps Skeena, Port Hope Ontario, founded in 1941, has a long and honoured history, serving the community of Northumberland County by providing valuable citizenship training to the local youth. The local corps shares its name with the Second World War 2 naval destroyer, HMCS Skeena, and 2019 marks another 75th Anniversary in the history of the cadet corps. Their ship was wrecked in Iceland on October 24h, 1944, while on duty serving our country, with a loss of 15 crewmembers.

In 2004, on the 60th anniversary, cadets and officers from the unit visited the graves. Dying in the service to your country is the ultimate sacrifice and warrants the most respectful recognition. Subsequent visits by unit staff to Iceland in 2005 and 2006 has resulted in the construction of a monument, listing the names of the lost crewmembers in perpetuity.

It is the wish and will of the unit to honour their past and install a sense of respect and pride with the local youth, by embarking on a unit excursion to Iceland in the fall of 2019. We are launching a fundraising campaign to support the travel with the entire unit, so a full guard of honour can be assembled for the commemoration. This excursion will include a visit to grave site and monument, which will include a remembrance service conducted by our cadets and many others. This excursion will have a positive effect on the cadets installing a sense of gratitude to the veterans that have served this country. We plan on sharing the lessons and stories of this excursion with the community following the Remembrance Day Ceremonies in 2019.

I have had the honour of escorting HMCS Skeena veterans twice to Iceland. Over the years these veterans have shared with me their stories aboard the ship and their horrific tales of survival as the ship was breaking apart. Over the next year, as we approach the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary, I plan to feature these stories in the Missile called "The Skeena Stories; the untold history of HMCS Skeena 1931-1944". Please join me in the next year to learn more about HMCS Skeena.


