


Loonie Dart

The Loss of HMCS Skeena; Chapter 12 We Will Remember Them

Between the 21st and the 27th of October 2019, the cadets of 116 Royal Canadian Sea Cadet Corps "Skeena", travelled to Iceland to commemorate the 75th Anniversary of the loss of their namesake HMCS Skeena. HMCS Skeena was lost on the evening and early morning of 24-25 Oct 1944, wrecked in a fierce North Atlantic storm, as the ship was wrecked on the rocky shore of Videy Island.

On the morning of the 25th, the cadets and staff woke up to a rather windy and very cold morning. Looking out from their hotel they could see Videy Island, less than a nautical mile off shore. It is mind boggling to think, exactly 75 years ago, on this date, HMCS Skeena was wrecked on the coast of the island that we could easily see from the shoreline of the capital Reykjavik. Learning that the storm was so intense, the British and American authorities at that time did not attempt a rescue at this time and left the surviving men aboard HMCS Skeena to their own distress.

Our morning was cold, wet, over cast and windy, making the seas between the mainland and the island of Videy treacherous. Although the wave height was not as high as it was 75 years ago, the captain of the ferry boat decided on a shorter route to the island, a much safer passage to the island. A short trip on our boat and we landed at the dock on Videy Island. Most visitors to Videy arrive during the warm summer months and take in the breathtaking views of the mountains and nature around them. We arrive on the island, alone, cold and wet, with a very brisk wind blowing off the cold North Atlantic Ocean into our faces. Not much different than the men of the Skeena faced during their rescue, 75 years earlier on the exact date.

In an informal group, the 21 cadets begin their trek to the north west point of the island. This is the place where the Skeena was lost and where a monument now sits, in memory of the 15 men who perished on the shoreline where the monument rests. The monument is the salvaged propeller from HMCS Skeen that was dedicated in 2006 by surviving veterans of HMCS Skeena.

Videy is an island made of volcanic rocks, with a fine layer of grass and moss covering the surface. A course gravel path leads the almost 2 km trek from the dock to the location of the propeller monument. Although cold, the cadets never complained. They were remembering how the survivors of Skeena, had to make the same trek; wet cold, scared, oil covered, in distress. The cadets quietly make their way up the slow incline, walking in silence trying to imagine what it would have been like for their shipmates so long ago.

Taking about 40 mins the cadets finally arrived at the propeller monument and the shoreline where Skeena was wrecked. As the cadet leader, it was interesting to see the cadets and their reaction to being in such a place. Without direction the cadets gathered around the propeller and stood in silence, some with their heads down, and a few reaching and touching the monument. A few turned their heads away... at first, I was thinking it was to shield their faces from the wind, but it was to look out across the cove to the sea, seeing the location where the Skeena was wrecked and the rocky beach where their shipmates perished.

We stayed at the monument for about 45 minutes, some of the cadets asking me questions about that fateful night. Questions and queries about what happened. I shed a tear, as my dream of getting the cadets to Videy Island was finally achieved. The last time I was on Videy Island was 15 years prior and I made a promise to the Skeena surviving veterans that the ship, HMCS Skeena would never be forgotten and their service to our country would never be forgotten. I can honestly say, WE WILL REMEMBER THEM.

On Thursday Dec 12th, 1830 hrs for 1900 hrs the cadets of RCSCC Skeena with be conducting a remembrance service and thank you celebration at the Cobourg Collegiate Institute, if you are interested in attending please rsvp to skeenaiceland@gmail.com, all members of the public are welcome to attend.
