



The Loss of HMCS Skeena; Chapter 5, Two Sisters Joined Together at Birth and at Death.

In 1931, the Canada government of the time took possession of two war ships. Although these two ships were built overseas in an English shipyard, they were the very first ships to be built for the still very young Royal Canadian Navy. These two ships, HMCS Saguenay and HMCS Skeena were built to new Canadian specifications and were fitted out with the latest naval warfare equipment of the time.

Both ships entered the war in 1939 and were immediately tasked with convey service escorting allied shipped across the Atlantic Ocean. They were the true first fighters of the Battle of the Atlantic. The fighting career of HMCS Saguenay ended early in 1942, when her stern was lost to a convey collision at sea. She was eventually towed to Halifax where her stern was sealed off and she remained as a training ship for the remainder of the war. The fighting career of HMCS Skeena also ended tragically as it was in the early hours of Oct 25, 1944, HMCS Skeena found herself floundering on the rocky shore of Videy island Iceland with the loss of 15 crew members. She was declared a complete loss at this time.

In 2004 the Icelandic Coast Guard dived on this site looking for hazardous wartime ammunitions, and located the propeller from HMCS Skeena. In 2005 I saw this propeller first hand and assisted with the selection of a proper spot to build a monument using the propeller in commemoration of the loss of HMCS Skeena. It is hard to explain the feeling seeing this huge relic setting in the shipyard, all covered in seaweed and mud, knowing that it is the only surviving part of the ship.

In the ship yard I borrowed a scrapper and a wire brush, as I wanted to clean up part of the propeller as I could faintly see some engraving on the bronze metal. To my amazement, the letters "H-M-C-S" appeared. Further work then revealed a "S "and my excitement took hold as I knew the word "S-K-E-E-N-A" would soon appear. Frantically working away expecting the next letter to be a "K" ... but the letter "A" appeared (??). Then followed by a "G". Further scrapping away uncovered the word "S-A-G-U-E-N-A-Y".

How could this be? Was this not the propeller from the Skeena? What was the propeller from HMCS Saguenay doing in Iceland on the ocean floor were HMCS Skeena went down in 1944? HMCS Saguenay left service in 1942 and was never in Iceland; a mystery needed to be solved. A frantic call back to Canada, it was discovered HMCS Skeena entered drydock in 1942 for some much-needed stern repairs. Work was performed on her propeller it is believed Skeena's propeller was replaced with a spare propeller from Saguenay, as Saguenay's was not needed due to her current condition.

In August 2006, I traveled back to Iceland to unveil the newly cleaned up propeller as a monument in memory of HMCS Skeena and in memory of the men who lost their lives. It was during the unveiling ceremony, to my amazement, looking at the cleaned-up propeller, right in front of me was the word "S-K-E-E-N-A". Now that the propeller had been sand blasted removing the debris that I could not take off with my wire brush, this procedure revealed the stamping "SKEENA" over top of the word "SAGUENAY". Two sister ships launched together, and although single propeller in memory of Skeena; the two ships were now joined together forever. The propeller sits on a very large flat rock, in a field on the north west part of Videy Island Iceland. The propeller is now a recognized Canadian War Monument in memory of those brave Canadians who fought in the Battle of the Atlantic 1939-1944, aboard HMCS Skeena.

October 2019 marks the 75th anniversary of the loss of HMCS Skeena. The local sea cadet corps is named after this ship, and it is the wish of the cadets of RCSCC Skeena to attend services in Iceland this year to commemorate the loss of their ship.
