

The Loss of HMCS Skeena; Chapter 14 "You Can Not Imagine ..."

This past October, I had the pleasure of escorting the cadets of 116 Royal Canadian Sea Cadet Corps "Skeena" to the resting spot of where their namesake, HMCS Skeena was wrecked on Videy Island Iceland. 75 years ago, on the evening of 24 October 1944, 15 members of her crew perished on the shores of Videy Island.

This trip to Iceland, marks my fourth time to Iceland to commemorate the loss of HMCS Skeena. Twice I have escorted survivors of the ship, once on the 60th anniversary of her loss and another in 2006 when the ship's propeller was unveiled as a monument honouring the loss of Skeena. This last October marked my fourth visit to Iceland and Videy Island, this time with the cadets of RCSCC Skeena to commemorate the 75th anniversary of the loss of HMCS Skeena.

Recently, many friends and colleagues have been asking me what has been the driving force that has led me to this remote spot on Videy Island and to the graves of the Skeena Crew members.

It was in 1993 that the second ship to bear the name Skeena was decommissioned and I had just read a book called "Skeena Aground", written by Isaac Unger, a bother of one of the crew members buried in Iceland. With the second ship bearing the name Skeena now gone, this left the local Skeena sea cadets to remember the loss of Skeen in 1944. So, on the 50th anniversary, we held a very simple service in Port Hope, laying 15 poppies in front of a picture of the ship, we recited the naval prayer, and rang our ship's bell 15 times. All in remembrance of our ship, HMCS Skeena.

This simple service carried on for many years until the last few survivors of the ship, decided to hold their annual reunion in Port Hope. In 2001 I had the pleasure of meeting many of the men who survived the loss of Skeena. I tried to ask many of the men questions as to what happed that tragic night so many years ago, however many were very private about what had happened. At that reunion I had the pleasure of meeting the Reverend Davidson, who was the minister in Iceland that laid the Skeena dead to rest. It was his words that he said to me that still ring in my mind.

I was puzzled why so many of the men were guarded in what that shared about the evening of the 24th October 1944, and the minister shared with me that even today the Skeena burial service still bothered him. I was puzzled as here was a man who admitted to bury so many men during the war but admitted it was the Skeena burial that still bothered him mentally. Of course, I asked why and was amazed at what he shared.

"You can not imagine the size of the hole in the ground for so many men". Due to the fact that wood was a scarce commodity in Iceland during the war, the wooden coffins that were given to the Canadian Navy by the American Army posted in Iceland, but were returned and the men were wrapped in burlap and the White Naval Ensign. A mass grave was dug and 13 bodies were laid out in two rows, with the 14th body buried a few days later. The 15th body was never found.

"You can not imagine the size of the hole in the ground for so many men" These words still resonate in my mind and it is those words that have led me to ensure that the memory of those 15 men will never be forgotten. I can not imagine the size of the hole in the ground for so many men, however I will never forget that there were so many men buried in a common grave. I will remember them.
