"Here is the transcript of my Remembrance Day message delivered at Victoria Park . 3 QUESTIONS:

Why? What? How?

WHY DID OVER 116 000 CANADIANS GO TO WAR IN A PLACE OVER 3500 MILES AWAY?

 $WW1: More\ than\ 650.000\ Canadians\ and\ Newfoundlanders\ served\ in\ this\ war,\ then\ called\ The\ Great\ War.$

More than 66,000 of our service members gave their lives and more than 172,000 were wounded.

During the Second World War, approximately 1,159,000 Canadians and Newfoundlanders served. The number of deaths totalled 44,090.

HUNDREDS MORE WERE KILLED IN OTHER. WARS AND INVOLVEMENTS SINCE THE TWO GREAT WARS. WHAT? WHAT DID THEY DIE FOR? TO OVERCOME REGIMES WHICH HOLD DIAMETRCALY OPPOSED IDEOLOGIES TO THE DEMOCRATIC FREEDOMS WE HOLD PARAMOUNT. WAS IT OUR BUSINESS? IT WAS AND REMAINS OUR BUSSNESS ONLY IF WE BELIEVE IN THOSE VALUES THAT AFFORD FREEDOM AND DIGNITY, TO EVERY PERSON.

TO PROTECT OUR SOCIETY FROM TYRANICAL OR OPPRESIVE RULE. BECAUSE OF THEIR SACRIFICR, CANADIANS ARE FREE TO CHOOSE THEIR GOVERNMENTS, CHOOSE THEIR VOCATION, LIVE SAFELY AND PEACEABLY, PRACTICE THE FAITH OF THEIR CHOOSING. THESE ARE PRECIOUS FREEDOMS. THEY HELD AND WE HOLD DEAR, FREEDOMS WHICH WERE THREATENED, WERE SEEN TO BE WELL WORTH FIGHTING FOR AND EVEN DYING FOR. IT IS ONLY BECAUSE OF WHAT THEY DID AND THE SUPREME PRICE THEY PAID THAT WE ENJOY THES FREEDOMS TODAY.

THAT IS WHY WE ARE HERE; TO REMEMBER.

HOW? NOT, HOW DID THEY DO? But rather; HOW ARE WE DOING? HOW ARE WE TODAY UPHOLDING THE LEGACY THEY EARNED FOR US. THE CATECHISM QUESTION: WHY DID GOD MAKE ME? GOD MADE ME TO KNOW HIM, SERVE HIM AND TO LOVE HIM. THE TEN COMMANDMENTS IS A GREAT TEMPLATE TO LOOK AT AND SEE HOW WE ARE DOING IN THAT SENSE.

MARK 12:30 (The Great commandment) Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.' The second is this: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' JN 15;13 Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends.
